



Consent to Release Information Form

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (“FERPA”) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of Student Education Records. FERPA gives students who reach the age of 18 or who attend a post-secondary institution the right to inspect and review their own educational records. It also prohibits the sharing of information with parties not designated by the student to view education records.

The NRAEF does not release information from a student’s educational record or scholarship application without the student’s written consent.
